Audition Preparation

Applicants who live in a remote area and cannot attend an audition can submit an audition submission and video statement when completing the QUT Online Registration Form. The required format is video/s made available on YouTube and set to <u>unlisted</u>.

If you scheduled to attend an audition and do not attend you cannot be considered for a place in the course.

Audition/Audition Submission

Live performances of two contrasting pieces OR Live performance of one piece of music and presentation of one recorded piece OR Presentation of two recorded pieces Live performance You can perform on any instrument - orchestral, acoustic, amplified, electronic (eg. computer turntable etc.), non-western (eg. sitar, djembe, etc.) You can audition on more than one instrument so long as it fits within your 10 minute total duration If you are attending an audition, you need to arrange your own accompaniment if required (maximum of 2 other musicians). You can use backing tracks on Smartphone, USB or YouTube. Recorded pieces Suitable items include written and/or performed compositions for acoustic instruments, music realised using computer software, pop songs, recorded/engineered/produced music, etc, that you have created or been involved in creating The required format is video/s made available on YouTube and set to unlisted You will be expected to advise the panel of your precise role in creating the recorded piece/s Interview/Video Statement As part of your audition, you will also be interviewed by the selection panel. During the interview you will be asked about: Your past experiences in music activities What sort of music you enjoy playing and listening to		It two pieces with a total duration of no more than 10 minutes. If you cannot attend an audition and are submitting an audition submission and video statement, your video statement should address the above 4 points (total 5 minutes max).

Supporting documents

Bring to your audition the following documents.

A copy of your most recent High School report and/or results of previous Tertiary studies
Evidence of your highest musical qualification (e.g. AMEB theory examination results, review of performances, etc)
If presenting recorded pieces, written notes explaining your role in the creation, how you created and your aims in creating the recorded piece/s

Documents must be received by 5pm Monday 15 September. Documents received after this time cannot be considered.

Selection Criteria

The selection panel looks for evidence of a strong track record in relevant music activities and knowledge of the QUT Creative Industries music course and how this relates to your own personal goals and potential for continued growth in your music understanding and practice. The selection panel also considers your creativity and originality of approach, technically and creatively appropriate skills in presentation, clear articulation of musical approach, general sense of musicality and musical engagement and the diversity of material presented.
