

Fashion Portfolio and Interview Preparation – International Applicants

Portfolio Requirements

Your portfolio should include a maximum of 25 pages of colour images that best demonstrate your current fashion achievements, working processes, commitment and potential. Keep pages to a maximum of A4 size and do not include large folders.

Structure your portfolio as follows:

- ☐ Page 1: Full name
- ☐ Page 2: Resume or curriculum vitae
- ☐ Page 3: Personal statement outlining your reasons for applying, personal strengths and future ambitions (max 300 words)
- ☐ Pages 4-25: Demonstrate your design process including research, experimentation, and final pieces. Could contain photographs of current creative projects, design sketches and sources of inspiration. Most importantly it should give us an idea of who you are: your creativity and your particular areas of interest in fashion and design. Try to include examples of work that you have done independently of school or other courses.

Interview Preparation

Following the assessment of portfolios, applicants will be shortlisted for interview. Interviews will be conducted from Monday 3 until Wednesday 5 November 2014 at Z5, Musk Ave, [QUT Kelvin Grove Campus](#). If you are unable to attend the interviews, we will arrange a telephone interview.

During the interview you will be asked to speak about your interest in the course, your ambitions, your knowledge of fashion, and your academic history. You may be asked to explain more about your portfolio including your design process. You may also be asked to tell us about your broader interests such as film, art or music and how they influence your work. As part of the interview process you will complete a design activity in the Fashion Studios.

Selection Criteria

The selection panel looks for evidence of a strong academic record and work ethic, and the ability to think creatively and critically about fashion and be open to new ideas and challenges. The selection panel also considers your creativity and imagination, visual and professional communication and design process and problem solving.

Feedback

Due to the large number of applications received, the selection panel is unable to provide feedback to applicants.
